

# Deer, Boar and History—Serbia 2018

In May of 2018, my wife Elaine and I travelled to Serbia to hunt Roe deer and Russian boar with Alexander Belancic of Safari EHA. We won the auction for the hunt at the 2017 Anchorage Chapter SCI banquet. One of our reasons for pursuing this hunt was that Alexander had included several days of touring historical Serbian sites as well as hunting. In addition, on our trip we toured several eastern Baltic states before travelling to Serbia. Plane connections were reasonable and readily available for all of our European stops and for our return to Alaska from Belgrade, Serbia.

Upon our arrival in Belgrade we were met by Alexander at the airport, and travelled by car to Novi Sad where we were provided lodging in the "old town" at the Fontane Restaurant and Hotel. Food was good, the staff friendly and professional, rooms small but clean, quiet, and comfortable, and we were located on the boundary of a vehicle free pedestrian zone which provided us the opportunity to explore a bit in the evenings.

The next morning I was met by "Sveck", the game manager for about 40,000 hectares east of Novi Sad. He would be my guide for Roe deer. We began the day around 04:30a, and used a late model Toyota pickup for exploring the vast agricultural fields of wheat and canola east of the city and north of the Danube. We saw several dozen deer and by late morning had taken a small but nice representative buck for the species. He will look great on the wall at home. This was my first experience hunting in

Europe, where the game managers are solely responsible for the animals, and the landowners have no vested interest in the game populations. Significantly different from other countries I have hunted and from the U.S. The buck may have weighed about 55 pounds, and after securing the trophy we delivered the carcass to a butcher shop for processing. I was told the venison would be given to the local fire department as a donation to support a family barbecue.

On day 2 of hunting Alexander met us at the Hotel for an early breakfast and a few hours of "waiting". Hunting boar in eastern Europe was a truly interesting experience. The area around Novi Sad has a good road system, and we didn't leave the hotel until we received word from another game manager that a boar



had been sighted. This put us on the road for about 45 minutes to travel to the estate where we would hunt the boar. Upon arriving at the estate we met the game manager for the area and a representative of the estate. After introductions the game manager accompanied us to the section of the estate where the boar had been seen. We left the vehicle in a small stream valley lined with agricultural fields and having a brush-filled watercourse meandering through it. After a short hike we found the boar at the edge of the fields near the brushy area and were able to quickly dispatch it. This greatly pleased the game manager as an aggressive wounded boar could have been a problem for the workers tending the fields. After a few pictures the boar was loaded into our vehicle and delivered to a butcher shop for processing. The boar weighed around 400 pounds with "gold medal" tusks. I was glad that Alexander had provided me a 7mm Remington Magnum for this hunt and which seemed well suited to the hunting conditions.

On days three through five we went touring. The itinerary included the following locations:

- Petrovaradin Fortress in Novi Sad.
- Kalemegdan Fortress in Belgrade.
- St. Sava Orthodox Cathedral in Belgrade.
- Several Monasteries in Fruska Gora near Novi Sad.

These historical locations are easily researched on the web, and Safari-EHA has a good website at http://www.safa-ri-eha.com/ for more information on hunting opportunities.

We had a great trip and really enjoyed the historical touring that Alexander provided.

# GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS REPORT

SCI Alaska Chapter continues to demonstrate its position as one of the most influential outdoor groups in Alaska and the nation. From elections to legislation to the regulatory process, AK SCI was heavily involved over this past year.

On the federal front, we worked hard with key chapter members like Tina Cunning to craft new savings clause language to be inserted into any federal legislation that would clearly acknowledge the states as owners and managers of fish and game resources within their boundaries. Because of the unique position Alaska has within state and federal leadership, we can ensure that any legislation over the next two years dealing with hunting and conservation will have to have the language we developed in it to pass.

SCI continues to participate in the federal regulatory process with comments in support of hunters as federal bureaucrats, even in the age of Trump, continue to promulgate and defend anti-hunting policies. At this time we are involved in a couple of lawsuits defending our members' right to hunt. Included in those litigation efforts is Board Member John Sturgeon's lawsuit against the National Park Service. This case is extremely important as it will decide who has management authority on state has owned waters and lands. Oral arguments were back in November and with the appointment of Justice Kavanaugh, we are hopeful Mr. Sturgeon will win. John spent over a million dollars on this case and could really use some financial support. Donations can be made at www.ohfak.org.

Here on the home front, AK SCI was active on both the legislative front as well as in key elections and ballot initiatives. During the last legislative session this past spring we were instrumental in amending a bill by Governor Walker that if it had passed would have made it crystal clear that hunting would be a preferred use on state refuges. It passed the Senate with all Republicans and one Democrat voting in favor. On the House side the House Majority blocked the bill from going to the floor for a vote.

For the first time in years there was an anti-hunting ballot initiative to deal with during the 2018 elections. Ballot measure 1 purportedly was for preserving Alaska's salmon stocks, but as is often the case; the devil was in the details. Ballot measure one was so poorly written that if the wrong folks were to be elected they could have shut down the state economically, not to mention blocked access to your favorite hunting grounds.

Last of all, SCI Alaska Chapter membership and leadership played a very important role in the election of Governor Mike Dunleavy. It may sound cliché, but elections do have consequences and the results put an avid hunter and outdoorsman in the Governor's office. We are hopeful that we will once again be led by a Governor who will stand up for state management authority and will strive to ensure that our freedom to hunt will be preserved. In one of his first moves he appointed one of the strongest leadership teams in recent times to lead the Alaska Department of Fish and Game.

In looking back over 2018, we had a pretty good year. We won some major battles and lost very few, but we can do better. Your AK SCI leaders are heavily invested in time and resources to preserving your freedom to hunt. You could lend much needed assistance by getting more involved. Past President Stacee Kleinsmith was also presented the President's Award recognizing her efforts on the annual fundraiser and her contributions to the Chapter's important missions.






